# SUPERINTENDENT'S CORNER



Greetings Tulpy Families!

I can't believe that we are already heading into the winter months. The first quarter is over and Christmas is fast approaching but with that comes the threat of snow and ice! Ugh! Typically once November 1st hits, we begin watching the weather on a normal basis just in case the white stuff decides to sneak into the forecast. So, I want to take a few moments to explain our process and how we arrive at an inclement weather call.

Long before you get that official delay or closure call, our staff has been hard at work. The operations department, transportation department, and myself, monitor the weather through multiple forecasts to determine the scope and timing of the storm. If we can make a solid decision about the timing and impact of the storm, after discussions with our operations director, transportation contractor, and neighboring school district superintendents, we will make the call ahead of time (possibly the night before) to give families as much notice as possible. I realize that this sometimes means a delay or closure is called before snow has even fallen, but I can tell you that as a father of three kids, knowing the night before that my kids' school is closed or delayed allows my wife and me the opportunity to put plans in place for child care.

If the call is not made the night before and we wait until the next morning, the workday for our operations department begins early morning. They will begin plowing and salting to get sidewalks and parking lots clear for school. There are staff members out on the roads driving to determine road conditions. Our first bus pulls out of the lot around 5:30am to begin picking up BCTC students, so in most cases, the decision to delay or close is made between 4:00-5:00am. Once I officially make the call, this triggers our leadership team to post on news stations, websites, and social media, as well as, our notification system.

I can tell you as a kid I used to sit in front of the tv begging and hoping that the superintendent would close school. Now that the job is now mine, I dread snow days. The calls are never easy. There are times the roads are great south of I-78 and terrible north of I-78. Our district spans 100 square miles which is the second largest in the county behind Hamburg ASD. I know there will be times that we might disagree on whether it was the right call or not, but I want you to know that I will always make the call I feel is the safest for our students, families, drivers, and staff. School closures or delays are not an easy decision and require a lot of careful planning and discussion.

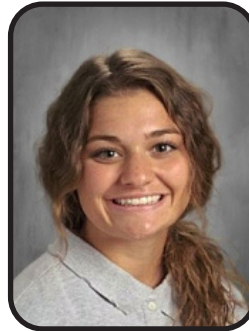

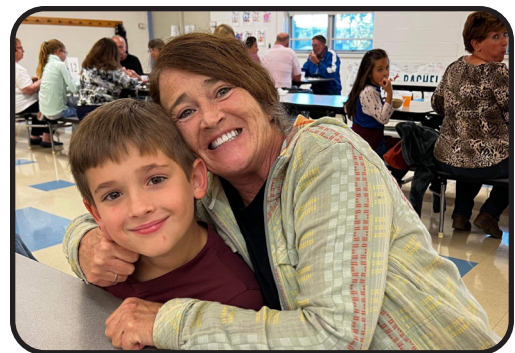


## BETHEL ELEMENTARY STUDENTS OF THE MONTH OCTOBER 2022

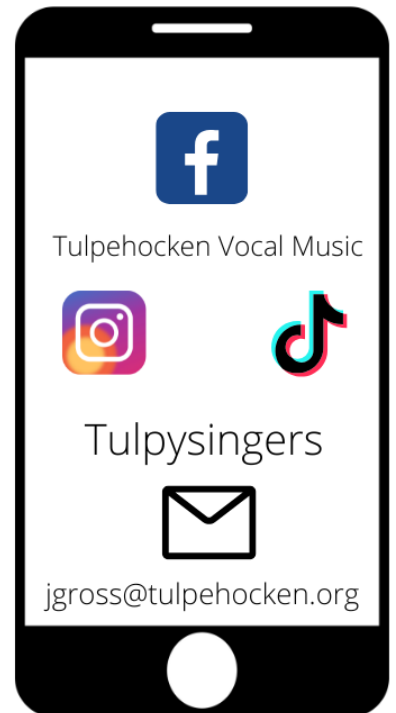

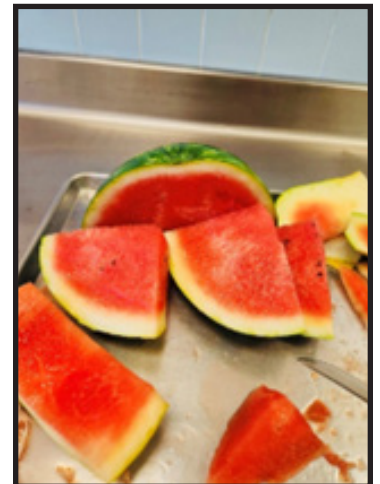
# WANTED: BAND INSTRUMENTS

# LOCAL STUDENT ACCEPTED INTO PENNSYLVANIA FREE ENTERPRISE WEEK

This summer, senior Frankie Fantozzi, along with other high school sophomores and juniors from all around Pennsylvania had the opportunity to participate in the award-winning, summer economics education program called Pennsylvania Free Enterprise Week (PFEW). Since 1979, over 47,000 eager students have experienced PFEW and gained the knowledge, skills and qualities vital to their future success as responsible, involved citizens in our increasingly competitive global economy. Frankie was granted a \$625 sponsorship to attend PFEW 2022 on the campus of Pennsylvania College of Technology in Williamsport, PA. The sponsorship is from local businesses, chambers, foundations, civic associations and individuals. The sponsorship covers all program materials, activities, meals and lodging for their week-long stay on campus, excluding a nominal registration fee and transportation to and from Williamsport.

At PFEW, students form teams of 16-18 students and one adult business mentor who become the simulated management team of an underperforming manufacturing company in heated competition with other student companies. Teams operate their company for a simulated three-year period, making the same decisions today's businesses face daily. Students are immersed in finance, production, marketing and advertising, and all facets of modern business operations. Throughout the week, world-class speakers address the students on a wide variety of topics geared toward their personal and professional development. The PFEW program provides student with opportunities to assess interests, develop skills, and identify and explore careers aligned to those interests in an interactive, hands-on setting. PFEW puts students on track for meaningful postsecondary education, employment and success.

Totally funded, taught, and staffed by the Pennsylvania business community, PFEW is supported by eight manufacturer's associations, more than 100 chambers of commerce, and more than 700 companies who believe the PFEW education is vital to Pennsylvania's future. The program is offered by the Foundation for Free Enterprise Education, a 501(C)(3) non-profit organization. 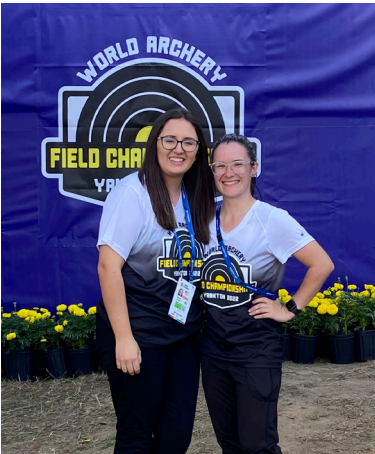

The highly competitive program is designed to provide recipients in the field of science, technology, engineering, and math with full-ride scholarships, annual stipends, summer internships, and guaranteed civilian employment with the DoD upon graduation. Travis has been selected to study in the U.S. Army's DEVCOM C5ISR Center in Fort Belvoir, VA, where she will work together with peers on developing technology to detect underground explosives for the Army.

She continued her education at Penn State University, Berks Campus and completed her degree of Applied Psychology with National Honor Society and Psi Chi in 2021. She has recently started her new adventure in life by moving to Yankton, South Dakota. Many of you may ask, Why Yankton? The answer is simple. Yankton is home to the largest archery center in the world. Ross currently not only runs this amazing center, but she is also the resident archery coach for the Mount Marty University team. Running the center doesn't mean that she only deals with archery. She runs weekly air rifle classes, hosts parties and events at the center, and even helps coordinate tennis and soccer practices. Think that's enough to fill her plate? Well, think again because from October 1-10, she was helping host a World Field Championship.
