PENN-BERNVILLE CANSTRUCTURE TEAM WINS 1ST PLACE

On May 2nd, the Penn-Bernville CanStructure team won 1st place in the elementary division of the Youth Volunteer Corps annual CanStructure competition. This is the second year in a row that the Penn-Bernville CanStructure team has won 1st place!

Each year, Youth Volunteer Corps and Voice Up Berks team up to hold this community service project open to all school districts in Berks County. Teams are challenged to build a structure out of cans and boxed items that connect to the chosen theme. This year the theme was “Stronger Together”. The Penn-Bernville team started meeting in January via zoom to begin planning their design. The students’ design depicts two scenes; one is the state of Pennsylvania which the students created with a wall of cans and the second is a scene of Berks County on the floor where the students chose to create an urban and rural landscape. The students raised over \$2,000 through a Coin War activity held at Penn-Bernville. Using the funds raised, the team purchased over 2,000 cans and hundreds of boxed items which were all used in the build.

All of the items used to build the structure will be donated to Helping Harvest to help them continue their fight against hunger in Berks County.

The CanStructure team consists of 4th, 5th, and 6th graders from Penn-Bernville Elementary. Team members are Raymond Snyder, Caedence Thomas, Jolie Thomas, Carter Boltz, Samuel Joy, Sean Jacobs, Samuel Lutz, Luke Blimline, Rowen Hall, Cora Marous, Harper Hall, and Kylie Smith. Each student earned over 20 volunteer hours during the course of this project. Mrs. Sanders, Mrs. Jacobs, and Mrs. Marous helped advise the team on this project. 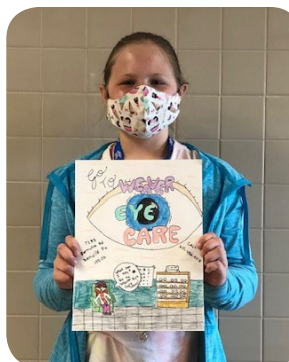
WEAVER EYE CARE GRADE 5 POSTER CONTEST

SUPERINTENDENT'S CORNER



Greetings Tulpy Families!

Over the last two years, our school board and leadership team have been engaged with an architect firm in order to determine where our district needs to go when it comes to the Junior-Senior High School. For anyone that has been in the school in the last few years or even on a daily basis, you know that the school is in need of renovation. The building has served us well over the last 55 years, but with major systems needing upgrades and the current building not meeting many of our educational needs it was time to make some decisions. With the help of Crabtree, Rohrbaugh, and Associates, several options were laid out and presented to our school board. After much discussion, during this past board meeting, the Board approved a renovation project in order to make a huge investment into the education of our students and community.

While the decision to take on a major renovation was not an easy one, one aspect that has made the decision a little easier is the financial outlook of the district. As you know, over the last five years, the district has been able to reduce property taxes. Our real estate millage is the second lowest in the county and lower now, than it was a decade ago. Through fiscal restraint and strategic budgeting, along with development within the district, we are able to undertake a \$56 million renovation project without the need to raise taxes to pay for it. We are confident that at the same time we embark on the renovation project, we will continue the fiscal practices. This is certainly something we should all be proud of as very few districts can say this.

We are currently in the design phase and will present a final design to the board for approval this fall. The hope is to go out to bid next winter with construction beginning Spring-Summer of 2022. In order to keep everyone informed, we have devoted a portion of our district web site to the Junior-Senior High School renovation project. TITLE I APPLICATION

It is the intent of the Tulpehocken Area School District to apply for Title I Federal Programs Funding for the 2021-2022 school year. Title I funding is provided to individual school buildings to provide supplemental core academic instruction, support, and parental involvement. The funding is awarded to schools based on the number of students in the building who qualify for free and reduced lunch. In 2021-2022, both Bethel Elementary and the Tulpehocken Junior-Senior High School qualify to apply for this funding.

Bethel Elementary plans to continue to use the funding to support the Response to Instruction and Intervention program by providing staff, resources, and materials to enhance the reading and math programs in the building. Bethel will continue to operate as a Schoolwide Title I Building meaning that the funds can be allocated to support all students in math and reading.

The Tulpehocken Junior-Senior High School plans to use the federal funding to support students with targeted research-based reading interventions. The JSHS building will operate as a Targeted Title I building meaning that students will be evaluated and placed into the specific reading assistance interventions based on multiple measures of performance.

The success of all of our students is our highest priority. Title I funding helps us to provide supplemental instruction and support for our students who are in need of additional support to be successful.

WEIGHT ROOM FINDS NEW LIFE

With COVID racing across the country, students at Tulpehocken needed a place to vent their stress. One place where this was evident was the high school weight room. According to weight room supervisor Kerry Lehman "We were above maximum capacity almost every day after school." To keep the momentum rolling, the health and physical education department planned on upgrading the weight room. Lead teacher Kevin Avery said "We want the students to take a stake in their personal fitness. The weight room is a great place for that."

Several upgrades to the weight room include new shadow boxes, weight room instruction videos, and the Iron Trojan after school strength program.

The new shadow boxes are showcased on the back wall of the weight room. Created by students with the help of Mr. Kelse Brown, the project was completed during a high school wood shop course. Students cut, sanded, assembled, and painted the boxes. Once completed, the physical education department added vintage Tulpehocken sports jerseys to complete the look.

Weight room instruction videos were also included to several pieces of equipment. Junior high students created "how to" videos on how to use many of the fitness machines for the weight room. Each video shows proper form, muscles used, and other variations for a particular piece of equipment. Simply take a picture of the QR Code with your telephone to watch!

Lastly, the PE department introduced a new program called the Iron Trojan. Students who work-out after school receive a punch card. Once the punch card is completed the students receive an Iron Trojan t-shirt. According to teacher and coach Trevor Brown "This new Iron Trojan program is changing the culture at Tulpehocken. It's so encouraging watching this many students buy into their personal fitness"

HIGH SCHOOL TRACK AND FIELD TEAM

The Tulpehocken High School track and field team had a fantastic season despite a rough start due to the pandemic. The team had many successes in all events, culminating in 12 athletes qualifying for the district 3 meet, followed by 2 athletes also competing in states.

Throughout the season many of our track team members had personal records, such as senior Austin Peiffer who ran a time of 18.98 in the 110 hurdles at the BCIAA Firing Championships. Another senior athlete, Clara Hardick, threw the discus an amazing 110' 6" during competition at the District 3 meet. This earned her a silver medal and a spot competing at states. Other seniors who participated on our team included Jonah Stull, Ryan Lopez, Lupe Bazan, and Kyle Yenser. We wish them all a great future as they depart Tulpehocken JSHS.

The Trojan Track team earned many other medals in addition to the silver medal earned by Clara Hardick in discus at the District 3 meet. The 4x800 team, consisting of Ethan Guss, Clint Haws, Jacob Straw, and David Bednarczyk earned 5th place. David Bednarczyk also gained 5th place in the 800 meter run. Camden Gehris vaulted an impressive 12' earning the bronze medal. Ella Ahner qualified for states by earning the silver medal in the 400 meter run, the gold medal in the 200 meter run, and the gold medal in the 100 meter run. At states, she medaled 8th place in the 100 meter run. All of our district and state qualifying athletes did an amazing job.

Each member of our Trojans' track and field team showed heart and great effort as they developed their skills and competed throughout the season. We look forward to further success from all our athletes.

INTEGRATED PEST MANAGEMENT (IPM)

Dear Parents or Guardians:

The Tulpehocken Area School District uses an Integrated Pest Management (IPM) approach for managing insects, rodents, and weeds. Our goal is to protect every student from pesticide exposure by using an IPM approach to pest management. Our IPM approach focuses on making the school buildings and grounds an unfavorable habitat for these pests by removing food and water sources and eliminating their hiding and breeding places. We accomplish this through routine cleaning and maintenance. We routinely monitor the school buildings and grounds to detect any pests that are present. The pest monitoring team consists of our school personnel. Pest sightings are reported to our IPM coordinator who evaluates the "pest problem" and determines the appropriate pest management techniques to address the problem. The techniques can include increased sanitation, modifying storage practices, sealing entry points, physically removing the pest, etc.

From time to time, it may be necessary to use chemicals to manage a pest problem. Chemicals will be used only when necessary, and will not be routinely applied. When chemicals are used, the school will try to use the least toxic product when possible. (Applications will be made only after school hours.) Notices will be posted in these areas 72 hours prior to application and for two days following the application.

Parents or guardians of students enrolled in the school may request prior notification of specific pesticide applications made at the school. To receive notification, you must be placed in the school notification registry. If you would like to be placed on the registry, please notify the district in writing. Please include your e-mail address if you would like to be notified electronically. Please send requests to: Tulpehocken Area School District, 27 Rehrersburg Rd., Bethel, PA 19507, Attention:Heston Frey.

If a chemical application must be made to control an emergency pest problem (ex: stinging insects), notice will be

provided by telephone to any parent or guardian who has requested such notification in writing. Exemptions to this notification include disinfectants and anti-microbial products: self-containerized baits placed in areas not accessible to students and gel type baits placed in cracks, crevices or voids.

Each year the District will prepare a new notification registry. If you have any questions, please contact Heston Frey, IPM Coordinator at 717-933-4611 ext. 1041.

ASBESTOS HAZARD EMERGENCY RESPONSE ACT

In accordance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), The Tulpehocken Area School District has conducted inspections of all the School District buildings for the presence of Asbestos Containing Building Materials (ACBM). An asbestos management plan for each building was developed detailing the location and condition of all ACBM along with the short-term actions to be taken to protect building occupants. These management plans are available for review by any interested person in either the District Administration Office or at the individual School during normal working hours.

AHERA regulations require a re-inspections every three years by an accredited building inspector. This triennial inspection was conducted during 2021.
