Tulpehocken Jr./Sr. High School will be offering the ASVAB assessment instrument, which is part of the ASVAB Career Exploration Program (CEP). Interested juniors and seniors are invited to take this assessment. It is a valuable tool to help students with their educational and career plans. It is essential for those looking to enter the military. The ASVAB CEP will help students:

- Learn more about themselves and the world of work
- Explore occupations in line with their interests and skills
- Develop an effective strategy to realize their career and education goals
- Meet the Act 158 Pathways to Graduation requirement

One of the scores on the ASVAB is the military services' entrance score which is used to determine eligibility for the various branches of the military. Scores are not released to the military unless the student/parent requests them with a military recruiter.
