All sophomores & juniors will rotate through the reality fair, an interactive hands-on budgeting experience to gain practical knowledge about personal financial management in a “real world” environment. Students identify their career choice and starting salaries then complete a budget sheet requiring them to live within their monthly salary while paying for basic needs such as food, housing, utilities, transportation, and clothing.

Students document their income and expenses using a sample checking and savings account, credit card or loan during the exercise and must balance their budget for the month, reviewing their final budget with a Financial Counselor.

The Financial Realty Fair is sponsored by local credit unions and run by volunteers.

Career Readiness

Many factors go into choosing a career path and devising a plan to accomplish that goal. During the first semester 7th and 8th graders explore their interests, educational goals, career cluster, and career information. In 8th grade students create a personalized career plan including possible career choice and its education requirements which can be used in preparation for the upcoming high school course selection process. Student career plans can be modified, refined, and enhanced throughout their high school years.

Current Juniors are invited to learn about an internship at the St. Joseph's hospital. The program will provide hands-on clinical experience and enhance personal and professional development in the health care industry. Juniors apply during this school year for a senior year experience.

Reading Hospital Internship Application

Application deadline is Friday, January 6

Current juniors interested in a work-based learning internship experience at the Reading Hospital must submit an application consisting of a personal statement, resume, letters of recommendation, and transcript. Be sure to follow guidelines for submitting the application material.

Interviews will be held at Tulpehocken in January. Students who are selected for the internship, must attend a Reading Hospital student/parent orientation. Interns must complete employment paperwork and Act 153 clearances. COVID 19 vaccination and TB tests are required as well as drug screening.

Additionally, as part of Tulpehocken's work-based learning program students selected as interns at the Reading Hospital must attend a parent/student work-based learning meeting at the high school in the spring and completed required work-based learning paperwork.

IBEW: International Brotherhood of
Electrical Worker's Apprenticeship
Application Process

Seniors interested in an electrician's apprenticeship must first determine if they reside in the Local 743 or Local 143 jurisdiction area. Plug a home address into the following link to locate the correct union to submit an application. <https://743electricaltraining.org/jurisdiction-map-2/> Applications are considered complete when both the application and transcripts have been received at the apprenticeship office.

The deadline for Local 743 is 12/31/22. Deadline information for Local 143 will be announced once confirmed. Watch for updated information.

Law Enforcement Career Program

The Pennsylvania State Police Hill Impact program is a free 14-week course for students ages 15-18 years old who are considering a career in law enforcement. Students are introduced to different elements of training and education, including physical fitness and paramilitary disciplines while gaining an understanding of what it takes to be a state trooper including the Pennsylvania crimes code, vehicle code, and rules of criminal procedure.

The program, held at the PA State Police Academy in Hershey, meets every Tuesday from January 17 - April 18, 2023, 5:30-8PM and some Saturdays from 9AM-1PM.
