This program can be used as a graduation project. Projects must be approved prior to the end of the school year. See Ms. Moore, the graduation project coordinator, in room 210.

<u>Pennsylvania Department of Education:</u> <u>Career Education and Work Standards</u>

Tulpehocken Area School District follows a set of standards required by the Pennsylvania Department of Education to provide activities in career development and employability skills for our students. Through exploring interests, aptitudes, learning styles, personality traits, career options, as well as high school and post secondary education options, students are able to develop a career plan that best fits who they are as a person. During the fourth quarter, students who are missing any assignments will be scheduled to complete them. The Career Education and Work Standards are characterized into the four following areas:

> Career Awareness and Preparation (13.1) Career Acquisition (13.2) Career Retention and Advancement (13.3 Entrepreneurship (13.4)

Career Portfolio and the Graduation Project

Tulpehocken's career education program begins in the elementary schools and continues throughout high school. Activities from the Career Education and Work Standard lessons are collected for each student as part of their career portfolio. The career portfolio is one part of the graduation project, which is requirement for ALL students. See student handbook/course catalog for more detailed information about the graduation project requirement.

The graduation project is worth 1 credit. To obtain this required credit, students MUST complete the following:

- \Rightarrow Career Portfolio (10 hours)
- ⇒ Graduation Project Experience: Career Development, Personal Development, Community Service or Research (25 hours) **
- \Rightarrow Written Paper (2 pages)
- ⇒ Oral Presentation (10-20 minutes on designated Saturdays throughout the year)

** Experiences MUST be pre-approved before beginning! See Ms. Moore in room 210 with any questions and for proposal form.

Post Secondary Education Lesson: Juniors

As part of the Career Education and Work Standards, juniors will learn about and explore the process for researching and applying for schooling after high school. Whether students are considering to join the workforce, enter the military, or continue schooling immediately after high school, it important to understand the process of higher education which can include technical training, apprenticeship programs, community colleges, 4-year colleges, and graduate schools.

A Higher Education Night and College Fair will be offered to further assist students and families in the college search process.

The Higher Education Night will be held in the evening for students and their families. We will delve further into exploring schools and the application process, including NCAA requirements for those looking to play sports in college.

Interested juniors will have the opportunity to attend a college fair during the school day at Alvernia College. Over 40 schools and military will be present to share information about their programs. It is a great start to exploring schools, then utilize the summer to visit schools.
