Work-Based Learning Internships

Application now being accepted for Summer 2023 and 2023-24 school year

Work-Based Learning is a career preparation activity in which students are placed in a workplace to participate in and gain skills within a given industry and career field. Students gain a deeper understanding of the career through hands-on experience. Work-Based Learning is individualized and tailored to the needs and interests of each student in the program.

Interested students submit applications to the Tulpehocken Work-Based Learning Coordinator, determines eligibility and possible appropriate placements. Students and parents are required to attend a work-based learning information session. Students complete applications and interview with the company Work-Based Learning site. The company ultimately decides if students are a good fit for their company and the work-based learning experience. Placements are not guaranteed.
